

Cambridge Courses at ELC Bristol

ELC Bristol has a long and successful history preparing students for the Cambridge exams. We are one of the only schools which regularly run Proficiency preparation classes.

Please read the following so you will know what to expect.

- At the start of your course, you are given a Cambridge exam course book, which forms the basis for your studies and covers the Cambridge syllabus.
- The maximum number of students in a class is normally 12 (very occasionally 13)
- The Cambridge classes are not closed so students can join for shorter periods than 11/12 weeks.
- Most, but not all class members, are exam candidates. A few of our long-term General English students also ask to join the classes.
- We do not believe in just practising with past papers; when you start the course, we familiarise you with the exam and then, as with the General English courses, we focus on the 4 skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking. In so doing, we help you reach the level of English required to pass the exams.
- Exam practice is given throughout the course, but especially in the weeks leading up to the exam and you do a mock exams 2 weeks before the exam date.
- If you would like to join a Cambridge course, we suggest you do our on-line test to make sure you are at the right level.
- The course fees are the same as our normal fees.
- The exam is taken at the local exam centre in Bristol.
- The exam fee is payable direct to the exam centre.
