



Electives

1. Business: An introduction to the English we use in Business, incorporating vocabulary, letter, email, memo & report writing, telephoning, speaking: negotiating, giving presentations, socialising, within a business context etc. Preparation for BULATS (Business Language Testing System) exam – a computer-based test that can be taken here at ELC.

2. Film studies: Are you interested in films and cinema? Do you want to learn/find out more about stars, directors and the movie industry? Using a range of language skills – listening, speaking reading and writing - this course looks at various different aspects of the film-making industry. Not for those who just want to watch films. Depends on numbers.

3. Conversation & Communication: Fluency practice for students who want to develop their oral communication skills and awareness of cultural differences in English. Teachers set up situations e.g. problem solving, role-play, information-gap, discussion and debate for students to participate in. Teachers monitor, join in and feedback.

4. English through Music and Song: This course will cover a wide range of music and will practise all the language skills; reading, writing and speaking as well as listening. Not for those who just want to listen to pop music. Depends on numbers.

5. British Life & Culture: An introduction to Britain and the way the British live, with their traditions and customs (leading to comparison with other cultures). Includes things like customs and traditions, history, politics, accent, class system, society. Depends on numbers.

6. English Literature: An opportunity to widen your vocabulary and enjoy a variety of literary texts (and film, where appropriate). Drama, poetry and prose are used as the basis for discussion of themes such as love and identity.

7. Academic English/ IELTS: An opportunity to develop the skills needed to manage in an English-speaking university/ college environment, focusing on reading, writing and vocabulary.
